✦ **Historical Museum** **232 N. Perkins**

Step into Burlington's story—from its earliest days to today. Discover exhibits featuring Native American heritage, early settlers, local businesses, and the people who helped shape our community. Discover unique chapters of our past, including the Voree Mormon settlement, the Underground Railroad, and the Burlington Liars' Club!

✦ **Research Library** **232 N. Perkins - 2nd Floor**



Don Vande Sand Research library is open to the public during museum hours and by appointment. Explore a rich collection of local history, including documents, photos, newspaper archives, and genealogical resources.



✦ **Whitman School** **401 Beloit Street**

Discover the story of Burlington's first school building, a restored one-room schoolhouse dating back to 1840. As the town's first structure built solely for education, Whitman School marks the humble beginnings of our local school system. Learn about early classrooms, explore historic artifacts, and discover what education looked like in the 1800s!



✦ **Pioneer Log Cabin** **Wehmhoff Square**



Visiting the Pioneer Cabin is like stepping back to the 1850s. Furnished with authentic items from our collection, the cabin offers a glimpse into early settler life. While you're there, be sure to check out the historic tool shed just behind the cabin. Take a moment to enjoy the beautiful vintage garden surrounding the Pioneer Log cabin.
